the boundaries of the bed that order its flow.

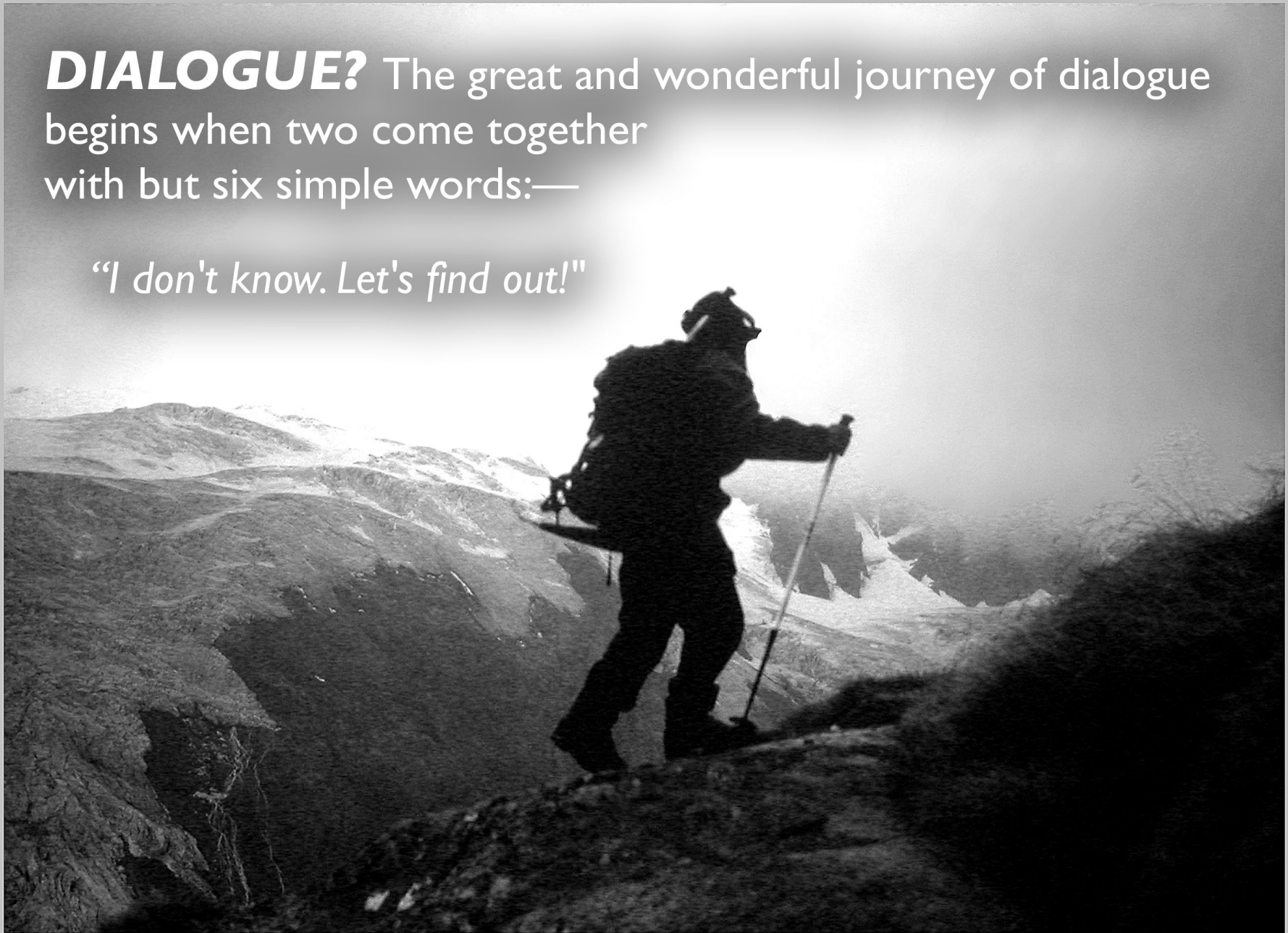




Suddenly, you're out of the game, alone in the cold, and for one terrifyingly long moment, **DEAFENED** by the sound of whirling stars.
